[Purpose of this notice; FLEET / SAFETY LETTER 2016-May-25]

This notice summarizes and specifies the intervals for maintenance, testing and inspection of the fire protection systems and Lifesaving appliances.

Application of this notice;

1. This notice applies to all Vanuatu-flagged vessels.
2. Our surveyors will confirm that the maintenance and testing records are kept on board the vessel in accordance with this notice at every periodical survey for Safety Equipment.



Applicable to: This circular should be brought to the attention of ship-owners, ship managers, operators and masters of Vanuatu-registered ships.

RE: SCHEDULE ON THE SERVICING OF LIFESAVING AND FIREFIGHTING EQUIPMENT
 The below schedule outlines the Vanuatu Requirements for the servicing of Fire Fighting equipment on board Vanuatu Registered vessels. This schedule takes in to account IMO Resolution A.951(23) however owners are reminded that Resolution A951(23) are guidelines and not mandatory requirements. The Administration considers the below to be the minimum requirements. If a vessel's Recognized Organization has other guidelines, VMSL will consider allowing the vessel to use them.
