

INFORMATION BULLETIN No. 205 MINIMUM AGE REQUIREMENTS FOR SEAFARERS

Guidance and instructions for Barbados Recognised Organisations, Barbados Approved Nautical Inspectors, Ship Owners, Managers, Masters, Seafarers, Recruitment & Placement Services and Authorised Manning Agents

1. Purpose

- 1.1 The Maritime Labour Convention 2006 (MLC 2006) specifies a minimum age requirement for seafarers employed or engaged or working on board a ship and the International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers 1978, as amended (STCW) specifies minimum age requirements for certification of some seafarers on board a ship.
- 1.2 This Bulletin outlines Barbados requirements in relation to the minimum age for the purpose of compliance with MLC 2006 and STCW.
- 1.3 This Bulletin shall be read in conjunction with BMSR Bulletins 180,184,198,203.

2. Application

2.1 The minimum age requirement is applicable to all ships registered with BMSR and to all seafarers, except where expressly provided otherwise.

3. General Requirements

- 3.1 No person below the minimum age of 16 years shall be employed, engaged or work on a Barbados registered vessel. (Section 103, The Shipping Act, 1994)
- 3.2 No seafarer under the age of 18 shall work at night. For the purpose of these requirements, 'night' means a period of at least nine (9) hours starting no later than midnight ship's time and ending no earlier than 05:00 ship's time.
- **3.3** The requirement for night work may be waived where: i) the seafarer is engaged in a training programme that has been established by the ship-owner. The training programme and schedule of night time work should be documented in the Safety Management System; or ii) the specific nature of the duty or programme, as recognized by BMSR, requires the performance of duties at night. The Employer shall undertake a ship-board assessment which should determine that the work will not be detrimental to the health and wellbeing of the person under 18.
