Subject: MLC enters into force for New Zealand on 9 March 2017

Date: 24 May 2016

Maritime Cook Islands wishes to inform you that the Maritime Labour Convention (MLC) will enter into force for New Zealand on 9 March 2017, from which date Maritime NZ will be able to inspect for compliance with the Convention on foreign-flagged ships in New Zealand ports.

It covers commercial vessels of 200 gross tonnage or more, that operate outside the in-shore limits. It does not apply to fishing vessels.

The Convention will apply to about 890 foreign commercial cargo and cruise ships visiting New Zealand annually, and about 30 New Zealand ships.

Cook Islands ships in New Zealand ports will be inspected for compliance with the Convention during Port State Control inspections and in response to complaints.
